- Aarvy Aardvark Finds Hope by Donna O'Toole -- Aarvy has lost his family and is filled
 with despair and hopelessness until a true friend helps him learn about the strengths
 within himself.
- When Dinosaurs Die: A Guide to Understanding Death by Laurie Krasny Brown -Straightforward and compassionate, When Dinosaurs Die explains death, dying, and
 coping with grief and loss in simple and accessible language for young kids and
 families.
- Grief is a Mess by Jackie Schuld -- Grief is a Mess is an illustrated book for grieving children and adults who need a healthy dose of understanding, comfort, and laughter.
- The Invisible String by Patrice Karst Specifically written to address children's fears of being apart from the ones they love, The Invisible String offers a very simple approach to overcoming loneliness, separation, or loss with an imaginative twist that children easily understand and embrace.

Books for Grandparent Loss

- Grandpa is Flying in a Spaceship by Shosh Carmel -- This moving story is laced with flowing rhymes and inspiring illustrations that encourage both parent and child to internalize the tools needed to properly handle grief and develop the courage to find comfort, and eventually happiness following a loss.
- When Your Grandparent Dies: A Child's Guide to Good Grief by
 Victoria Ryan -- Explaining what happens from a child's-eye view,
 the elves depict the difficult days before, after, and beyond a
 grandparent's death. They explore the meaning of death and
 heaven, as well as how to stay close in spirit with a grandparent
 who has died.



- Nana Upstairs and Nana Downstairs by Tomie dePaola -- Tommy is four years old, and he loves visiting the home of his grandmother, Nana Downstairs, and his greatgrandmother, Nana Upstairs. But one day Tommy's mother tells him Nana Upstairs won't be there anymore, and Tommy must struggle with saying good-bye to someone he loves.
- *Tell Me About Heaven, Grandpa Rabbit!* by Jenny Album -- This gentle and uplifting story is designed to help young children come to terms with losing someone special.
- *Grandpa Loved* by Josephine Nobisso -- By remembering the treasured times he spent with his grandfather, a boy realizes how loved ones never really die, but live on in the minds and hearts of those whose lives they touched.
